I mentioned in previous articles that we are working through a series of grids; one for each of the four major topics identified at our Community Consultation Events and our Stakeholder Workshop. We have now incorporated all the comments raised within the Community and Stakeholder sessions. That means that everything has now been captured within the grids and we have an audit trail back to the consultation sessions.

School Questionnaire

The information from the school questionnaire has now been taken away by our planning consultant to amalgamate into the grids. There were three sections for them to complete:- Things you like; Things you dislike; Ideas to help improve Queniborough. Some of the comments from the questionnaire were fascinating and all were uplifting and I'll share some of them with you in the next Gazette.

Key in many returned forms was that they all seemed very aware of the potential dangers from people parking at the school during drop-off and pick-up times and were keen to see some type of solution.

Next Steps

Our latest meeting, where we were joined by our planning consultant, Colin Wilkinson gave us a proper steer on the way forward. Colin indicated that the grids were of high quality and that the information contained within them was more than sufficient for him to prepare our first draft Queniborough Neighbourhood Plan.
