Where are we in the process?

We are now in the middle of working through a series of grids; one for each of the four major topics identified at our Community Consultation Events and our Stakeholder Workshop.

The four topics and the working group team leaders are:-

- 1 History & Heritage Ben King
- 2 Traffic & Transport Liz Ellis.
- 3 Open Spaces and the Environment Neil Ransom
- 4 Housing Mike Jones

The team leaders are being supported by other members of the Steering Group and some willing volunteers. I'd like to thank them all for the hard work they have done to date and of course the hard work they will do in the future!

The completion of the grids is quite complicated. Because of this, the Team leaders got together to work on the History and Heritage grid to get a feel for the complexity and to produce a set of guidelines to make the completion of the other grids a little bit easier.

During this month the working groups aim to have the grids completed as far as they are able. We will then plan our next steps based on the results of those working groups when we meet in August.

One of these next steps will be to gather evidence to support the findings identified in the grids which will probably mean, amongst other things, the production of a questionnaire to be issued to every household in the village.

Once completed, these grids will form the basis of our draft Neighbourhood Plan.
